



## Medical Case Manager Certification Requirements

### Attendance at the following:

1. HIV 101 for Case Managers (1 hour) – prior attendance in 2007 or 2008 valid
2. Opportunistic Infection Jeopardy (1.5 hours) - prior attendance in 2007 or 2008 valid
3. Review of HIV Therapy (1 hour) – prior attendance in 2007 or 2008 valid
4. Two hours of Cultural Competency training at either a Delta AETC or National Minority AETC training (2 hours) – starting January 1, 2009
5. 8 hours in clinic seeing patients with a HOP provider (or Children’s Hospital of New Orleans) arranged through the Education Coordinator of the Delta AETC (8 hours) – starting January 1, 2009
6. Twelve additional hours of Delta AETC Training starting January 1, 2009; examples may include:
  - a. Medical Case Management Clinical Conferences given monthly at NORAPC
  - b. HIV Series for Clinicians televised to DMI sites throughout LA 9-11 months per year on the second Wednesday or given live at HOP on the following Thursday
  - c. Annual HIV Update Conference usually given in April of each year
  - d. Additional Clinical training beyond the required 8 hours
7. Examination of 30-40 questions of basic HIV and therapeutic knowledge with at least 85% correct. Questions will be based predominantly on information from the three core lectures. A good study guide would be the ANAC HIV/AIDS Core Curriculum book, 3rd Edition.

### Maintenance of certification (must be done over 12 month period):

1. Review of HIV Therapy yearly – either Base Training presentation or Update course
2. 1 hour of Cultural Competency Training at either a Delta AETC or National Minority AETC training
3. Twelve additional hours of Delta AETC training; examples may include:
  - a. Medical Case Management Clinical Conferences given monthly at NORAPC
  - b. HIV Series for Clinicians televised to DMI sites throughout LA 9-11 months per year on the second Wednesday or given live at HOP on the following Thursday
  - c. Annual HIV Update Conference usually given in April of each year
  - d. Clinical training at HOP or Children’s Hospital of New Orleans following Dr. Wilcox or Dr. Hull or another HOP HIV care provider
4. Examination of 20 questions with at least 85% correct (given twice yearly)
